The Reason Why This U.S. Navy Destroyer Flies a Pirate Flag

Anniversary of the Founding of the U.S. Space Force

You usually don't see warships rocking the Jolly Roger.

In early December 1941, Rear Admiral Isaac Kidd was the commander of Battleship Division One at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. During the <u>Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor</u> on December 7, 1941, Kidd quickly went to the bridge of his flagship, USS *Arizona*, to take charge of his battleships. Kidd, along with 1,176 other sailors and Marines, was killed when the *Arizona* sank under multiple bomb and torpedo hits. His body was never found.

Admiral Kidd, the highest ranking officer killed at Pearl Harbor, was later awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor. His Medal of Honor citation reads:

"...for conspicuous devotion to duty, extraordinary courage and complete disregard of his own life, during the attack on the Fleet in Pearl Harbor, Territory of Hawaii, by Japanese forces on 7 December 1941. Rear Admiral Kidd immediately went to the bridge and, as Commander of Battleship Division ONE, courageously discharged his duties as Senior Officer Present Afloat until the U.S.S. ARIZONA (BB-39), his Flagship, blew up from magazine explosions and a direct bomb hit on the bridge which resulted in the loss of his life."

According to *The War Zone*, the first USS *Kidd*, a *Fletcher*-class destroyer commissioned in 1943, adopted the skull and crossbones and overall pirate theme as a play on 18th century Scottish pirate William Kidd. Admiral Kidd's nickname at the US Naval Academy was "Cap," a reference to the pirate Captain Kidd. The ship got the all-clear from Kidd's widow to associate itself with both the pirate and the captain, kicking off almost 80 years of tradition.

Today's USS *Kidd* is a guided missile destroyer of the *Arleigh Burke* class. The ship does regularly fly the Jolly Roger.

The Founding of the U.S. Space Force

On Dec. 20, 2019, President Donald <u>Trump signed the</u> <u>2020 Defense Authorization Bill</u>, establishing the U.S. Space Force as the first new branch of the U.S. Military since the establishment of the U.S. Air Force in 1947.

The Space Force has Cold War origins

The Space Force takes over a mission once charged to the U.S. Air Force.

Space emerged as a potential theater of war with the Soviet Union at the beginning of the Cold War. Satellite and missile control and defense were critical in maintaining an edge over Soviet forces, but when the Cold War ended, the need to operate in space remained. U.S. dominance in space gave advancing U.S. and Coalition forces a significant edge against the Iraqi Military during the Persian Gulf War.

As peer nations rose to power and terrorism developed into an ever-present threat at the turn of the century, the need for a dedicated Space Force gained traction in Congress and the Department of Defense. Nearly 70 years after the Air Force first started exploring the possibility of space serving as an avenue of warfare, the U.S. Space Force was officially chartered.

<u>Legacy of the U.S. Space Force</u>

As military, political, and commercial interest in space continues to grow, the potential for future conflicts in this new theater increases. The U.S. Space Force stands ready to protect America's interests in space while assisting all other branches of the U.S. Military to carry out their respective missions.

Alvin Cullum York

(December 13, 1887 – September 2, 1964)

Known by his rank as **Sergeant York**, was an American soldier who was one of the most decorated <u>United States Army</u> soldiers of <u>World War I</u>. He received the <u>Medal of Honor</u> for leading an attack on a <u>German machine gun nest</u>, gathering 35 machine guns, killing at least 25 enemy soldiers and capturing 132 prisoners. York's Medal of Honor action occurred during the United States—led portion of the <u>Meuse—Argonne offensive</u> in <u>France</u>, which was intended to breach the <u>Hindenburg line</u> and force the Germans to surrender. He earned decorations from several allied countries during WWI, including France, <u>Italy</u> and <u>Montenegro</u>.

World War II Veterans Now Eligible

The Department of Veterans Affairs announced that all World War II Veterans are now eligible for no-cost VA inpatient and outpatient health care.

Under this expansion, all WWII Veterans who served between Dec. 7, 1941, and Dec. 31, 1946, are now eligible for VA health care, regardless of their length of service or financial status. These Veterans will not have to pay inpatient or outpatient copays, enrollment fees, or monthly premiums.

VA is reaching out by phone and mail to encourage WWII Veterans who are not currently enrolled in VA care to apply today. Veterans who enroll may also keep their private providers, Medicare, and most other insurance to meet their health care needs.

All WWII Veterans are encouraged to enroll in VA health care – the best, most-affordable health care in America for Veterans. Veterans who are enrolled in VA health care are proven to have better health outcomes than non-enrolled Veterans, and VA hospitals have dramatically outperformed non-VA hospitals in <u>overall quality ratings</u> and <u>patient satisfaction ratings</u>.






