Besides executing and updating a valid Living Will, consider also getting a Limited Power of Attorney and an Advance Directive.

The reasons for the last two documents is that you or a loved one may become incapacitated and/or unable to either sign legal papers or request Do Not Resuscitate efforts.

Keep notarized copies of these documents which may be requested by a hospital or others.


The USPS Informed Delivery allows you to view greyscale images of the exterior, address side of letter-sized mail pieces and track packages in one convenient location.

# **NUISANCE CALLS**

Each of us gets those irritating nuisance calls and we probably handle them in different ways.

- 1. Answer each one, wait for the end, and opt to opt out for future calls (which may be a ploy to find active numbers).
- 2. Ignore all calls and which you do not recognize (but you may miss a few important calls).
- 3. Try to screen calls as they come in.
- 4. Use the Federal free and never-expiring <u>Do</u>
  <u>Not Call Registry</u> 1-888-382-1222, but that does not always work.
- 5. Do not list your number in the phone directories, but scammers use software to call almost every possible combination of phone numbers.
- 6. Land lines usually get more nuisance calls, so many only use cell phones.
- 7. Many scammers use phones, so do not kneejerk react to them. Investigate before doing anything.
- 8. Do not engage in prolonged conversations with unrecognized callers...just hang up.
- 9. Changing your phone number may not be a good ploy (see #5, above).
- 10. Try reporting some callers.

Some of us just smile, some get angry, but realize that there is really not much you can do to stop them all.

Hope you do not fall for any April Fools hijinks!



#### **FREE? TAX PREPARATION**

Each year, millions of people have their taxes prepared for free by IRS-certified volunteers. The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance and Tax Counseling for the Elderly programs have helped people for more than 40 years.

- 1. The IRS works with local community groups to **train and certify** VITA and TCE volunteers.
- 2. **VITA** generally offers free tax return preparation to those who qualify.
- **3. TCE** is mainly for people age 60 or older. The program focuses on tax issues unique to seniors. AARP participates in the TCE program through AARP Tax-Aide.

VITA and TCE provide **free electronic filing**. E-filing is the safest, most accurate way to file your tax return.

If you combine e-file with <u>direct deposit</u>, you can get your refund faster.
