#### **YOUR MONEY?**

Thousands of veterans may qualify for a higher <u>Social Security payments</u> because of their military service.

Veterans who served active duty any time from 1957 through 2001 may be eligible for extra Social Security money.

Additional income up to \$1,200 per year of earnings credit may be added to a veterans income for the period of time the veteran was in the military.

The extra \$1,200 credit per year of service can make a substantial difference in the calculation of Social Security monthly payments upon a veteran's retirement.

A veteran must bring their <u>DD Form 214</u> a nearby <u>Social Security</u> office and simply ASK for the benefit to be added to their account.

## Family Support Network

#### **Current Procedures**

- The call is received at the tollfree number: 800-504-4098 or e-mail: familysupport@legion.org
- 2. The name, address, telephone number of the caller, and reason for the call is collected.
- 3. The call is referred to the Department.
- 4. The Department refers the call to a local post.
- 5. The local Post contacts the family and provides the assistance if resources are available or refers the family to other local agencies.
- 6. In case of financial need, the Post provides the necessary funds or assists the family in applying for Temporary Financial Assistance if there are minor children in the home.

#### **VA'S MILEAGE CHANGE**

Regarding the Veterans Choice Program, the VA will determine eligibility for the <u>Veterans Choice Program</u> based on the distance between your place of residence and the nearest VA medical facility using driving distance rather than straight-line distance.

This change has been published in the <u>Federal Register</u> for reference if needed.

The change from straight-line to driving distance roughly doubles the number of eligible veterans eligible for the program.

VA sent letters to the newly-eligible veterans to let them know they are now eligible for the Veterans Choice Program under this new expansion policy.

#### PTSD RESOURCES FROM OUR WEB SITE'S <u>VETERANS ASSISTANCE CENTER</u>

**REM Sleep Disturbances and PTSD:** Patients with a PTSD diagnosis may also experience disturbed or reduced amounts of REM sleep, which may make symptoms worse.

<u>Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder</u>: Persistent thoughts and memories are hallmarks of PTSD, and these thoughts often bother people during both the daytime and nighttime hours.

<u>Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder Treatment</u>: Treatment of PTSD usually involves psychotherapy and prescription medication to relieve depression and anxiety.

<u>Sleep Problems Persist After PTSD Treatment, Study of Active Troops Finds</u>: Nightmares and insomnia are the two main complaints of people suffering from PTSD.

Sleep and Mental Health: Psychiatric patients with issues such as anxiety and depression usually also experience sleep problems, and this is thought to be due to a strong connection between sleep and mental health.

<u>Conduct Disorder in Relation to Trauma and Sleep</u>: People who have experienced a trauma may develop a conduct disorder that involves some sort of disruptive behavior.

<u>Fear, Safety, and the Role of Sleep in Human PTSD</u>: A patient struggling with insufficient or poor sleep quality may not benefit from PTSD treatments and interventions.

What Dreams May Come: Treating the Nightmares of PTSD: A psychiatrist examines the sleep problems that can accompany PTSD and what is being done to address them.

**Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder:** PTSD involves intrusive and recurring recollections of a traumatic event, which often leads to agitation, mood changes, and insomnia.

Improving Sleep Can Aid Recovery of Veterans With PTSD and TBI: The sleep disturbance and deprivation that usually accompanies PTSD often makes the condition much more severe.

Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder Overview: Typical symptoms of PTSD include detachment from loved ones.
