Yes, I know we all know, yet... Check each email in your trash bin because *sometimes*, it is not trash.

When forwarding emails, delete any addresses from the original, before sending to others. It is a matter of privacy and security.

If you have not already done so, create an email address to be used when you have to use one in some cases, but do not want to use your personal or business one (s).

To quickly find an often used folder, rename it with an A to place it at or near the top of folders to eliminate scrolling down to it.

When sending to multiple addresses, use the Bcc: field, not the To: or the Cc: to hide addresses.

PAPERWORK

As we mature (grow older), it would behooves us to stop for a few moments and review what paperwork we have accumulated or need to acquire in order to assist loved ones in negotiating legalities after our demise.

Many people put off thinking about such matters, but, for the survivors, it can be important.

List the paperwork your loved ones will need to know about and the location(s) of those documents and information.

If you feel it necessary, engage legal counsel. Some organizations provide free assistance in such matters.

VA offers the following information:

The veteran's discharge certificate or DD 214

- The veteran's VA claim number or Social Security number
- The veteran's death certificates
- Government life insurance policy
- A copy of all marriage certificates and divorce decrees (if any)
- A copy of each child's birth certificate (or adoption order)

The veteran's birth certificate to determine parents' benefits
