#### **UH-OH**

If your router gateway ever stops working, turn it off for twenty seconds, then turn it back on.

- Press the router/gateway's reset button for ten seconds.
- If still not working, unplug it from the AC outlet or back of unit for ten seconds.
- 3. If still not working, call your ISP for them to do a remote reset and/or tell you if there is an outage.

Registering with the <u>National Do</u> <u>Not Call Registry</u> is no guarantee of not receiving unwanted calls, but it can't hurt.

You might purchase <u>call-blocking devices</u>, but they, also, offer no guarantees and you might have blocked a call you did want. Some callers change the numbers after one-time use.

The above options are only mentioned to try and give you some relief from robo calls.

#### **FUND RAISING**

A report from the field.

As Legionnaires, our mission is to support our fellow Veterans, youth, and community.

A few weeks back I received a phone call from the Senior Naval Science Instructor at Cairo High School asking for some assistance. For reasons unknown, the local AL Post had failed to offer support this year and he asked if I could get some support for awarding the American Legion Military Excellence and Military Scholastic Excellence Awards and present them at Awards Ceremony which would be held on May 11<sup>th</sup>. It only took a few phone calls to come up with over \$300.00 and medals and certificates were quickly on order. I also decided that as a member of Larry A. Hoff ePost 2100, that the medals and certificates should come from the post. That only took a few moments to get approval from Commander Green.

I then arranged for two retired Naval Officers, Captain Charles R. Parker and Commander Edward J. DeMartini (also a member of ePost2100) to present these awards. The Military Excellence Award was presented to Cadet Captain Caylyn Norton and the Military Scholastic Excellence Award to Cadet Lieutenant Jodi Lopez. The ceremony, which for the most part, was done by the cadets and was very impressive. This NJROTC Unit has excelled in all areas and received the Distinguished Unit Award, making it one of the top 30 units in the District.

In ongoing discussions with the Commander of the JROTC Unit and with \$250.00 on hand I then decided to get other Veterans involved in fund raising with a goal of \$500.00, which will sponsor five cadets for the Leadership Training program in June. The first \$250.00 will be given in the name of Larry A. Hoff ePost 2100.

All over that will be from the Grady County Veterans Honor Guard. We do not intend to stop at \$500.00! Programs of this nature offer unique opportunities for our youth. The Cairo High School NJROTC Program has produced its first Cadet destined to attend the U.S. Naval Academy and has been instrumental in producing high quality recruits for the U.S. Military. I believe that everyone would be proud of these young people.

## **ACTIVITIES FROM JESSE HOBBY**

The Honor Guard actually had a slow month, which is a good thing. We only provided Military Honors for one deceased veteran, Jerry Ray Sullenburger.

The service was at the National Cemetery in Tallahassee, FL on March 8, 2021. We provided full honors with thirteen members present for duty - Detail Commander, eight man firing party, three-man flag detail, bugler. Seventy-five-mile round trip in three vehicles.

Our other activity for the month was the purchase and presentation of ten flag cases to the families of veterans who died since the first of the year. Each case had a plaque with the veteran's name, date of birth, date of death, branch of service, and dates of service. We have an individual who makes the cases at a very reasonable price, following in his father's footsteps.

The total for all cases was \$300.00. The plaques are done by another person who is strongly pro-military and will not accept payment for her service.

You had asked, earlier, about the make-up of the Honor Guard. We have twenty members from four AL Posts (2100, 544, 265, and 122) and a VFW Post (8433). Our bugler comes from Bugles Across America. I will get pictures of Post 2100 members at our next meeting and forward to you.

We will be providing Military Honors for two deceased veterans on Saturday, April 17.
