JUNE 14TH: THE BIRTHDAY OF THE U.S. ARMY

June 14th: The Birthday of the U.S. Army | U.S. Army Center of Military History

America's Revolutionary War began on 19 April 1775 with exchanges of musketry between British regulars and Massachusetts militiamen at Lexington and Concord. As their fellow citizen soldiers from New Hampshire, Connecticut and Rhode Island responded to the alarm, a state of war existed between the four colonies and the British government. Called the Army of Observation, a force of New Englanders surrounded Boston and had the British troops who occupied it under siege, but they needed help. They appealed to delegates who represented all thirteen colonies to join them in the struggle for American liberty.

When the delegates to the Second Continental Congress convened in Philadelphia on 10 May, they soon learned that armed men commanded by Ethan Allen and Benedict Arnold had captured the British forts at Ticonderoga and Crown Point on Lake Champlain in New York. The constitutional crisis, in which Americans sought a redress of grievances from the British King and Parliament, had become open hostilities. The delegates realized that even though many desired reconciliation, they would now have to address the new military situation. The Congress took the next step that eventually transformed a local rebellion into a war for independence when it established the Continental Army: the force we know today as the U.S. Army.

Flag Day is a holiday celebrated on June 14 in the United States. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777 by resolution of the Second Continental Congress.^[1]

The Flag Resolution stated "That the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation.

Nicknames for the flag include the **Stars and Stripes**, **Old Glory**, and **The Star-Spangled Banner**. Credit for the term "Stars and Stripes" has been given to the Marquis de Lafayette, a French soldier who volunteered his aid to the Continental Army, led by George Washington, in the Revolutionary War against Britain.

Born on October 2, 1923, Williams grew up on a dairy farm in the tiny community of Quiet Dell, West Virginia. The youngest of 11 siblings, only five of whom reached adulthood, partly due to the devastating 1918 flu pandemic.

The Clearview Youth Flag Etiquette Program aims to empower 5th-grade student team with the knowledge, skills, and values necessary to honor and respect the American flag. Through engaging activities and experiential learning, participants will develop an appreciation for their country's symbols and traditions, fostering a sense of pride and responsibility as citizens of the United States.

Legionnaire/SAL member Eric Parsons has managed the Youth Flag Etiquette Program for the last 9 years.

The year-long program includes

Training session: Covered flag etiquette, including proper hoisting on Mondays and lowering on Fridays.

Detailed instructions on the significance of flag folding and its historical and symbolic importance

Interactive discussions on the history of the American flag and its evolution

<u>Hands On</u> -Practical demonstration of flag hoisting and lowering ceremonies under supervision.

Guided practice session on proper flag folding techniques.

<u>Recognition:</u> End of year ceremony to commend student team who demonstrate exceptional commitment and mastery of flag handling and were presented a Certificate and a 3 \times 5 embroidered flag. Encouraging students to become ambassadors of flag etiquette by sharing their knowledge and skills with peers and younger students.
