If you have a "smart-phone", be aware that it's camera function can serve more than just the taking of photos of people, scenery and events.

Your photos may help in the event of verifying a loss due to accident (fire/flood/robbery), but they cannot validate initial cost of the items. Some people save receipts, which is a good idea, too.

Our multi-function phones probably have features many of us do not use, but it could be a good idea to review what the phones can do. It can also be a good idea to backup data such as contacts, email addresses, and those photos.

For those who text, perhaps you should save/print any important legal and business communications

Here's a list of conditions veterans and dependents can put in a claim for with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) that applies to chemical exposures on many bases around the country where contamination was found:

Leukemia Bladder Cancer Miscarriage & Infertility Breast Cancer Multiple Myeloma Esophageal Cancer Myelodysplastic Syndromes Neurobehavioral Effects Hepatic Steatosis Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma Kidney Cancer Renal Toxicity Scleroderma Lung Cancer

Camp Lejeune Update

The 2012 Camp Lejeune law established that if you have 1 of 15 health conditions, you can file a claim with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). Eight of those were declared presumptive status in 2018, while the others will require more work to get approved. There's no legal recourse right now because claims are held up in the 11th District Court of Appeals,



simply because North Carolina has what's referred to as a "statue of repose" and the judge will not hear claims that didn't fall within this time limit (somewhat like a statute of limitations). Currently, many veteran advocate legal teams are

trying to fight this and figure a way around it, but nothing has happened yet.
