AMERICAN LEGION SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

All Applications must be completed on a typewriter or word processor.

Applicant must be a child or grandchild of a Veteran of military service who is or was a member of the American Legion in the Ninth District Department of Georgia.

(Sponsoring Post is responsible for verification of American Legion Affiliation.)

- 3. The applicant must be a graduating High School senior.
- 4. The applicant must live in Georgia.
- 5. Applicant must be sponsored by a Ninth District (Dept. of Georgia) American Legion Post.
- 6. Academic requirements include students' accumulated grade point average (GPA), class ranking and standardized test scores (SAT). Official records must be furnished.
- 7. Applicants must have participated in school and community activities.
- 8. This award is to be given on the basis of Academic Scholarship in core "only" subjects on 4.0 basis.
- 9. The applicant has a transcript of grades. The transcript must be an official document from High School and in a sealed envelope.
- 10. One Scholarship will be awarded for \$1,000.00.
- 11. Applications must be received by April 12, of the current year.
- 12. Applicant must have an endorsement from the sponsoring Post and High School Principal.
- 13. The winner of the Scholarship must contact Scholarship Committee by August 1st with notification of the College they will attend. The check will be made to the College to be applied to the applicant's account.

ASK YOUR SENATOR TO SUPPORT H.R. 3967

From Vietnam to the present day, members of the U.S. military have been exposed to toxic substances, both at home and abroad, which have killed many more than our enemy. For years, our government has hidden the ill effects of these toxicants from those who were exposed. And for years, the VA has denied their resulting claims.

H.R 3967, the *Honoring our PACT Act*, introduced by Mark Takano (D-CA-41), when passed into law, will provide veterans with the much-needed tools to address the health consequences of their toxic exposures during military services the acknowledgement of exposure; healthcare; research; resources; and more.

The bill, when passed into law, would:

- Concede exposure to burn pits and toxic environments;
- Provide healthcare based on toxic exposures;
- Add 24 burn pit and toxic exposure-related diseases;
- Add hypertension as a presumptive disease associated with Agent Orange Exposure;
- Provide a framework for establishing presumptive diseases in the future;
- Expand radiation-risk activities to include veterans who participated in radiation cleanup at Enewetak Atoll and Palomares, Spain;
- Including Thailand, Cambodia, Laos, Guam, American Samoa and Johnston Atoll as conceded locations for Agent Orange Exposure;
- Require registries for veterans who served at Ft. McClellan and for those exposed to PFAS chemicals.

Exposures to toxic chemicals are among the workplace hazards for members of the military, whether serving CONUS or during a deployment across the globe. We need to make it right for the more than 3.5 million veterans who suffer from the long-term effects of exposure to these toxicants, which, in many instances, are equally lethal to wounds inflicted by shrapnel and bullets.

VVA fully supports H.R. 3967, the *Honoring our Pact Act*. This comprehensive legislation is designed to remove the many hurdles veterans are currently facing when submitting claims for health conditions they have succumbed to because of exposures due to their military service, whether in the jungles of Vietnam, the sands of the Persian Gulf, or the burn pits of Afghanistan. Too many veterans wait years to see those claims successfully processed and dispersed, and some even die waiting for the adjudication of their claims.

On March 3, 2022, H.R. 3967, the *Honoring our PACT Act*, passed the House of Representatives by a 256 to 174 vote. In addition, on March 29, 2022, the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee held a hearing on the bill. We urge Chairman Tester and Ranking Member Moran, of the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee, to immediately move this bill out of committee and onto the Senate floor for a vote and passage.

Please contact your Senator NOW, and send the prepared letter, asking them to support passage of H.R. 3967, the *Honoring our PACT Act*, that will expand the list of named presumptive conditions for herbicide exposure to covered veterans.




